

1. Why is SIT bringing forward the first AY 2020/21 application cycle for Financial Assistance & Scholarships?

In view of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, SIT understands that students may be in need of urgent assistance. Hence, we are bringing forward the application period for the first cycle to try and assist you as best as we can.

2. What are available for students to apply in this first cycle?

Aside from the usual Public Bursaries, Donated Bursaries and Donated Scholarships, students who are affected by the Covid-19 pandemic can apply for the Student Relief Fund at SIT (Covid-19).

Below are the awards that will be available for application

- Student Relief Fund at SIT (Covid-19)
- SIT Mid-Term Scholarship
- Donated Bond Free Scholarships
- Public Bursaries
- Donated Bursaries & Study Grant

3. How do I apply for the awards listed above?

Students can apply for these awards via the IN4SIT. You may indicate which scholarships you wish to be considered for.

All Singapore Citizens will automatically be considered for the Public Bursaries. If you wish to apply for the Student Relief Fund at SIT (Covid-19) and other donated Bursaries, please indicate 'Yes'.

4. I am completing my programme in AY2019, can I still submit my application for this Financial Aid cycle?

Yes. Students who are graduating at the end of AY 2019/20 can still be considered for the Student Relief Fund at SIT (Covid-19).

However, they will not be eligible for all other awards.

5. What are the types of supporting documents that I must upload in my application?

You may find the document checklist guide [HERE](#). The types of relevant supporting documents for submission is dependent on each individual's application.

6. What if the documents I uploaded are incomplete?

You will receive notification via your SIT e-mail that your documents are incomplete. You are to upload the correct document as per the instructions in the notification e-mail.

You must upload the documents within 3 days upon receiving the notification. We reserve the right to reject your application if you fail to do so.

7. When can I expect to receive the outcome of my application?

If you have submitted all the relevant supporting documents and you are eligible for the respective awards, below is when you can expect to hear from us.

| Award | Period |

| Student Relief Fund at SIT (Covid-19) | From mid-May 2020* |
| Public Bursaries | From mid-May 2020* |
| Interviews for Scholarships | From end-August 2020 |
| Interviews for Donated Bursaries | From end-August 2020 |
| Final Outcomes for Scholarships & Donated Bursaries | From mid-September to mid-October 2020 |

*Outcomes for these awards will be released in batches. It will be dependent on when you applied and whether your application is 'Completed' with all the relevant documents

8. If successful, when can I expect to receive the funds?

There are two things you must first do if you receive a successful outcome

(1) Accept the Award (this step does not apply to Public Bursaries)

(2) Ensure that you have a crediting bank account details registered in IN4SIT. Without one, will result in delays to your disbursement.

For Public Bursaries – this is dependent on the timeline given by MOE. Please refer to the Annex A in your awarding e-mail to check the period of disbursement.

For all other awards – you can expect to receive your funds within 4 weeks of accepting the offer made to you.

9. Am I required to return any awarded amount if I withdraw from my programme subsequently?

Students who withdraw from their programme may be required to refund the award.

The final amount to be refunded will be reviewed after you have decided to apply for programme withdrawal.
